TOWN OF WALWORTH-VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT: Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may submit a request to vote an absentee ballot to their municipal clerk. A qualified elector is any US citizen who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day & has resided in the ward or municipality where they wish to vote for at least 28 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Photo ID must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued. Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail: Contact your municipal clerk & request an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may make written request to your municipal clerk for an absentee ballot in person, by mail, fax, email or at myvote.wi.gov. Your written request must include your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote; the address where the absentee ballot should be sent if different; your signature; & a copy of your photo ID. The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is Thurs 11/3/22 at 5pm. Voters who are indefinitely confined due to age, illness, infirmity or disability may not be required to provide photo ID. Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined, in the military, hospitalized or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the clerk regarding deadlines for requesting & submitting an absentee ballot. Voting an absentee ballot in person: You may also request & vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office during the days & hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person as follows: Tues 11/1/22-Thurs 11/3/22 11:00am-3:00pm or by appointment. Marie Baker, Town Clerk, W6741 Brick Church Rd PO Box 386, Walworth, WI 53184. The 1st day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is Tues 10/25/22. The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is Fri 11/4/22. No in-person absentee voting may occur on the day before the election. The municipal clerk will deliver voted ballots returned on or before Election Day to the proper polling place before the polls close on 11/8/22. Any ballots received after the polls close will not be counted.
